COMMONWEALTH'S MOTION FOR RECIPROCAL DISCOVERY

- 1. The names, addresses, and dates of births of all witnesses that the Defendant intends to call at trial.
- 2. Any written or recorded statements made by any witnesses that the Defendant intends to call at trial.
- 3. Any evidence, documents, statements of persons, or reports of physical or mental examinations that the Defendant intends to use at any hearing or trial in the above-captioned matter.
- 4. Notice of any defense of lack of criminal responsibility, or defense based on license, self-defense, claim of authority or ownership or exemption.
- 5. Notice of any prior/subsequent bad acts of any witness on the Commonwealth's witness list that the Defendant intends to use at trial.
- Notice of any character impeachment evidence or witnesses that the Defendant intends to use at trial.

As reason therefore, the Commonwealth states that such information is essential to facilitate full disclosure of all relevant facts. See Mass. R. Crim. P. 14(a)(3). The Commonwealth

requests that the Defendant supplement his responses to the above requests as required by Mass. R. Crim. P. 14(a)(4).
