

probable cause for the assault with intent to maim, that's for sure. I find probable cause on a disorderly person. Assault and battery with a dangerous weapon, a beer bottle, I find no probable cause.

Assault and battery is a troubling issue, and troubling in the following manner: I believe that in fact Mr. King went to stop a person who he had no right to stop.

The disorderly person I find not outside but inside, because when the officer came along and four or five people were standing there, I don't see how he can be disorderly.

The assault and battery on Thomas King, I suggest that Thomas King raced after him to stop him from going, and he had no right to stop him, so I find no probable cause on that.

Probable cause on disorderly person only.

I tried to explain earlier that I I'm concerned there was no assault with the beer bottle. It was a reckless misconduct when he hit the bottle on the post. If a death ensued, that would be involuntarily manslaughter. However, it's
