AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR SEARCH WARRANT

APPENDIX A

I, Lieutenant A. Wayne Sampson, being duly sworn, depose and say; I have been a police officer in the Town of Shrewsbury for approximately the last eighteen years. During this time I have been assigned to both patrol and investigative functions. I am currently assign as the Detective Division Commander. I have received specialized investigative training from the Massachusetts Criminal Justice Training Council and the Federal Bureau of Investigations National Academy. I am also a licensed attorney in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

On August 4, 1994 there was a major fire at the E Z Mini Storage, located at 869 Boston Turnpike in Shrewsbury. During the course of the fire, fire fighters were required to open storage area in order to put out the blaze. At some point, fire fighters opened storage bin C-341 in order to fight the fire. They were able to extinguish the fire within this storage bin.

On August 5, 1994 officers of the Shrewsbury Police Department along with Fire officials worked continuously from the time of the original fire on an investigation to determine the cause and origin of the fire. During this examination of the building, Sgt. Chester Johnson of the Shrewsbury police Department had occasion to inspect Storage bin C-341 which was open to public view due to the fire.

Inside storage bin C-341 was a 1990 Chevorlet Corvette Vin number 1Glyz23j615800956 which is listed to Michael Elbery of 31B Chilmark St. Worcester, MA.

Inside the passenger compartment, in plain view was an item wrapped in plastic and tape. This item is consistent with the shape of a rifle. A portion of the plastic can be seen through and appears in fact to be a rifle. Next to this item on the floor is a box marked "UZI". Through this officers training and experience, "UZI" is known to be a type of firearm, commonly a machine gun.

Mr. Elbery has been at the E Z Mini Storage four to five times since early this morning attempting to reach his storage bin C-341 with the stated reason of trying to lock it. During this time he made the following statement to Sgt. James Hurley, "I can't do anything anymore, I'm a convicted felon". Mr. Elbery stated to Sgt. Hurley that the vehicle belonged to him.

Mr. Elbery Rented storage bin C-341 on July 25, 1993 and as of 1600 hour on August 5, 1994, Mr. Elbery was standing outside the gate waiting for officers to allow citizens to enter the fire area.

This officer checked with the Worcester Police Department and determined that their records indicate that on January 28, 1991 they received a court memo confirming revocation of Mr. Elberys' right to possess firearms.

I respectfully request a search warrant for the purpose of searching bin number C-341 of the E Z Mini Storage located at 869 Boston Turnpike in Shrewsbury for the purpose of confiscating an illegally possessed firearm that is located in a 1990 Chevorlet Corvette owned and under the control of one Michael Elbery.
